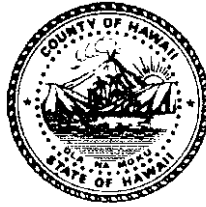

SUBJECT: Additional Farm Dwelling Agreement (FDA-12-000327)
Applicant: TASHA HOSE
Land Owner: IAN ALLEN HANAIEI HOSE and TASHA LEILANI S. K. HOSE
State Land Use: Agricultural
County Zoning: A-1a (Agricultural, minimum building site of one acre)
Land Area: 1.000 acre
Tax Map Key: (3) 1-7-018:008, Ola'a Reservation Lots, Kea'au, Puna

Pursuant to authority conferred to the Planning Director by Chapter 25, Article 5, Division 7, Section 25-5-77 of the Zoning Code and Planning Department Rule 13, Farm Dwellings, we have reviewed your request for an additional farm dwelling on the subject property. Your submittals included the following information:

1. Names, address and the signatures of the applicants/landowners.
2. A farm plan or evidence of the applicants' continual agricultural productivity or farming operation within the County, including an explanation of why this AFD is needed in connection with the agricultural productivity or farming operation. Your farm plan included the following existing and proposed income-producing agricultural activities:
 - a. Ongoing agricultural activities for the HI MOUNTAIN HONEY LLC, include the following:
 - i. Beekeeping operations comprising two onsite hives and other offsite hives;
 - ii. Maintaining/treating hives, harvesting honey, and cleaning/packaging

- honey requires eight (8) hours per week per hive;
 - iii. Monitoring pests & hive health, research & development, and bookkeeping requires an additional three to four (3-4) hours per week.
 - b. Proposed agricultural activities include the following:
 - i. Establishment of breeder colony hives for queen rearing;
 - ii. Expansion of hives and honey production;
 - iii. Marketing and distribution of honey.
 - c. Income derived from beekeeping operations includes:
 - i. Bee pollination services, \$65 per hive per month;
 - ii. Sales of honey, \$270 per hive per year.
3. Applicant's commitment to the farm plan will be shown in the form of the enclosed Additional Farm Dwelling Agreement affidavit, to be notarized and submitted for recordation with the Bureau of Conveyances, which states that the additional dwelling shall be used for farm-related purposes.

Findings:

1. In Chapter 205, Hawai'i Revised Statutes (HRS), the State Land Use Law does not authorize residential dwellings as a permitted use in the State Land Use Agricultural district unless the dwelling is related to an agricultural activity or is a farm dwelling. A **farm dwelling** as defined in Section 205-4.5, Chapter 205, HRS, **means a single family dwelling located on and used in connection with a farm**, including clusters of single family farm dwellings permitted within agricultural parks developed by the State, **or where agricultural activity provides income to the family occupying the dwelling.** (emphasis added)
2. The subject lot was created after June 4, 1976, which, pursuant to HRS 205-4.5(b), requires that the first dwelling on the lot to be a farm dwelling. If you have not already done so, please complete and submit the enclosed First Farm Dwelling Notice.
3. The Farm Plan and the agreement to use the dwelling for agricultural or farm-related activity on the building site demonstrate that there is income-producing agricultural activity.
4. In addition, the following agencies have submitted their comments as identified below:
 - a. Department of Water Supply (DWS) has provided comments, including but not

limited to DWS inability to provide additional water service to the proposed additional farm dwelling; the AFD shall not share the existing water service; there is no objection to the use of a private rainwater catchment system; and required installation of a backflow prevention assembly (*DWS memo dated September 17, 2012, maintained in departmental TMK file*).

- b. Department of Health (DOH) has provided comments, including but not limited to approval of the use of individual wastewater systems; construction noise constraints; and ground water quality (*DOH memo dated August 30, 2012, maintained in departmental TMK file*).

Decision:


In view of the above, your request to construct an **Additional Farm Dwelling** on the property is **approved** subject to the following conditions:

1. The AFD shall only be used to provide shelter for persons involved in the agricultural or farm-related activity on the building site. Family members who are not engaged in agricultural or farm-related activities are allowed to reside in the farm dwelling.
2. The agreement shall run with the land and apply to all persons who may, now or in the future, use or occupy the additional farm dwelling. The enclosed AFD Agreement must be returned to the Planning Department with the appropriate notarized signature(s) along with a check made out to the Bureau of Conveyances in the amount of \$30.00 in accordance with the enclosed AFDA Instructions. **The Planning Department will not approve a building permit application for the additional dwelling until the AFDA document and all required attachments have been accepted for recordation.**
3. All other applicable rules, regulations, and requirements of the Planning Department (including but not limited to the Zoning Code, Chapter 25), Department of Public Works, Department of Water Supply, Fire Department and State Department of Health and any other reviewing agencies/divisions listed on the Building Permit (BP) Application shall be adhered to.
4. The applicant is responsible for any State and Federal tax consequences due to the income produced from the farm activity.
5. Your AFDA has been approved based on ongoing and proposed agricultural activity as summarized previously in this letter.

6. The First Party (as identified in the Additional Farm Dwelling Agreement) shall allow the Second Party or its representative to inspect the farm upon reasonable prior notice.
7. The Department of Water Supply (DWS) has determined that a County approved water system is not available to support the AFD. An Additional Farm Dwelling that is not served by an approved water system may be permitted to use a water catchment system in an area that receives an annual rainfall of at least eighty (80) inches of rain per year. A minimum 9,000 gallon water catchment system for domestic consumption and fire fighting purposes shall be required for the AFD.
8. The Department of Water Supply requires that a reduced pressure type backflow prevention assembly be installed within five (5) feet of the meter on private property. The backflow prevention assembly installation must be inspected and approved by DWS staff.
9. This AFDA shall be valid for a period of two (2) years from the date of this approval letter to secure a Building Permit for the additional farm dwelling. Failure to secure a BP for this additional farm dwelling on or before October 24, 2014, may cause the Director to initiate proceedings to invalidate the AFDA.
