



This tree has been accepted by the American Forestry
Association for its Big Tree Registry as the largest coconut
tree in the United States - and it is so marked with a plaque.

Co-protectors of the tree are the state forestry department and Bryce/Jane Robinson, nominators of the tree to the Big Tree Registry.

The coconut tree is 92'5" in height, has a spread of 27'10", and a circumference of 5' d.b.h.
