Beginning at North angle at point marked  $\Delta$  at the foot of which is set a wrought iron tube 12" in diameter from which the Hawaii Govt. Survey A 1st. Sta. "Papaaloa" bears N. 46° 08' 41" E. "true" dist. 5626 ft. the boundary runs by true bearings:-

1. S. 61° 29' E. 1480 ft. along lower edge of forest to East angle in middle of Kaiwilahilahi stream.
