for the consideration of One Hundred and Fifty Eight (\$158.00) Dollars paid into the Exchequer, and for the further consideration of his having complied with the terms and conditions in Agreement of Sale dated July 25, 1895.

all that piece of land situate at Papaalooa in the District of North Hilo — Island of Hawaii — and described as follows:

Section No. 6.

Beginning at North angle at Δ marked Δ at the foot of which is set a wrought iron tube 12" in diameter from which the Hawaiian Govt. Survey Δ 1st. Sta. "Papaalooa" bears N. $46^{\circ} 08' 41''$ E. "true" dist. 5626 ft. the boundary runs by true bearings:-

1. S. $61^{\circ} 29'$ E. 1480 ft. along lower edge of forest to East angle in middle of Kaiwilahilahi stream.
2. S. $25^{\circ} 45'$ W. 935 ft. along middle of same to top of falls.
3. S. $51^{\circ} 19'$ W. 1150 ft. along middle of same to Δ marked in same to South angle.
4. N. $56^{\circ} 31'$ W. 100 ft. up bank of stream to post marked I. to edge of road.
5. N. $41^{\circ} 10'$ E. 453 ft. along East edge of road 40 ft. wide separating this section from section #7.
6. N. $31^{\circ} 30'$ W. 430 ft. along said East edge of road.
7. N. $9^{\circ} 16'$ W. 677 ft. along same.
8. N. $8^{\circ} 32'$ E. 861 ft. along same to the point of beginning.

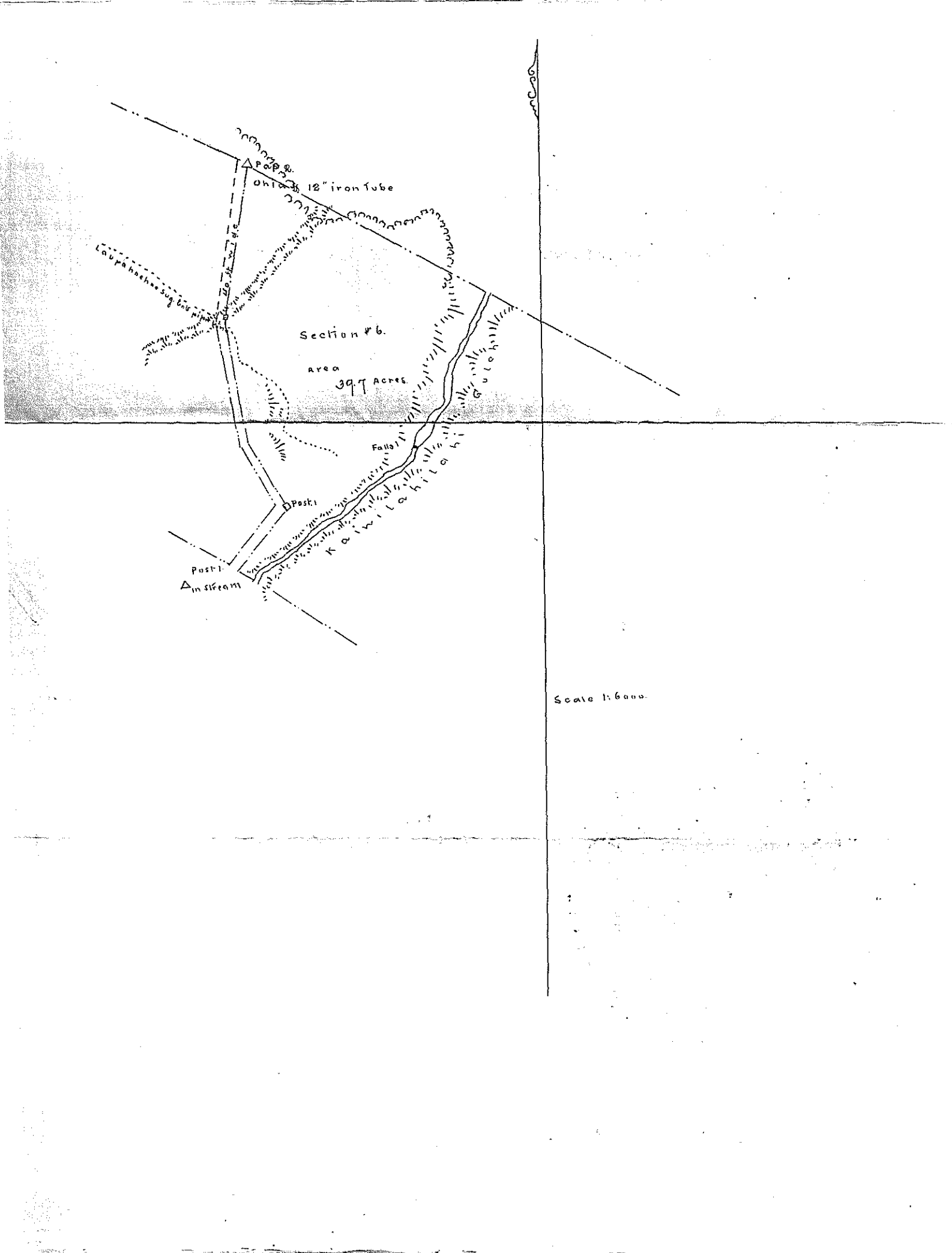
