We regret to inform you that after reviewing your application and comments received from the affected agencies, the Planning Director is hereby denying your ohana application. The reason(s) for the denial are as follows:

Article 20, Section (2) (2) of the Zoning Code, pertaining to Regulations for Ohana Dwellings, requires that, "The County determines that public facilities as specified in Section 3 of this article are adequate to service the ohana dwelling unit."

Said Section (3) (2) more specifically requires of the Ohana Owelling that, "It meets with State Department of Health wastewater treatment and disposal system requirements."

The determination of the Sanitation Division, State Department of Health, with respect to your application is as follows:

"According to Chapter 38, Private Wastewater Treatment Works and Individual Wastewater Systems Section 3.4 (A), minimum lot size required for duplex conversion is 10,000 square feet."

In view of the above, we have determined that the size of your lot does not meet with the minimum lot size requirement of the Department of Health for sewage disposal (cesspool) and therefore deny your request for an ohang dwelling.

The Director's decision is final, except that within thirty (30) days after receipt of this letter, you may appeal the decision in

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writing to the Board of Appeals in accordance with the following procedures:

- 1. A non-refundable filing fee of one hundred dollars (\$100).
- 2. Ten (10) copies of the petition for the appeal incorporating the following:
  - a. The name, address, and telephone number of the appellant and the name, title, and address of the appellant's representative.
  - b. A description of the property involved in the appeal, including the tax map key number of the property, and the appellant's interest in the property.
  - c. A plain statement of the nature of the appeal and the relief requested.
  - d. A statement explaining:
    - How the decision appealed from violates the law;
       or
    - 2) How the decision appealed from is clearly erroneous; or
    - 3) How the decision appealed from was arbitrary or capricious, or characterized by an abuse of discretion or clearly unwarranted exercise of discretion.
  - A clear and concise statement of any other relevant facts.
