The obert duality application and teleter submittels received dure 7, 1990 were reviewed under Article 20, Regulations for Clapa Dualing.

Section 2:-271 (3), Article 25, Regulations for Clana Evalling, of the Coming Code, states "That at the time of application for a County Puilding Permit for a second deciling unit, the subject lot or land is not restricted by a recorded covenant or a recorded lease provision (in a lease having a term of not less than fifteen years) which prohibits a second dwelling unit."

The copy of Description of Property and Restrictive Covenants submitted with the application states in part:

"1. That the property chall be used for private recidence purposes only including private garage and/or servant quarters and other similar purposes reasonably necessary in connection with such private residence and for no other purposes, and that there shall be no building other than a private dwelling house designed and built for the use of a single family."

Based on this, the above provision precludes an ohana dwelling on the subject tax map key parcel. Consequently, we have no choice but to deny your chana dwelling application.

The Director's decision is final, except that within thirty (30) - days after receipt of this letter, you may appeal the decision in writing to the Board of Appeals in accordance with the following procedures:

- 1. A non-refundable filing fee of two hundred dollars (\$200).
- Ten (10) copies of the retition for the appeal incorporating the following:
 - a. The name, address, and telephone number of the appellant and the name, title, and address of the appellant's representative.
 - L. A description of the property involved in the appeal, including the tax map key number of the property, and the appellant's interest in the property.
 - c. A plain statement of the nature of the appeal and the relief requested.
 - d. A statement explaining:
 - How the decision appealed from violates the law; or
 - 2) Now the decision appealed from is clearly erroneous; or
 - 3) How the decision appealed from was arbitrary or capricious, or characterized by an abuse of discretion or clearly unwarranted exercise of discretion.
 - e. A clear and concise statement of any other relevant facts.
