Application for VARIANCE by USAKU MORIHARA from MINIMUM SIDEYARD SETBACK REQUIREMENT in HONAUNAU, SOUTH KONA

VARIANCE PERMIT

The Planning Commission held a public hearing on March 19, 1970 on the application of Usaku Morihara for a variance from Section 13, Ordinance No. 63 of the Revised Ordinances of the County of Hawaii 1967, as amended, more specifically, to allow a variance from the sideyard setback requirement, Tax Map Key 8-4-15:9.

The Commission finds that strict enforcement of Section 13 would involve practical difficulty and unnecessary hardship for the following reasons:

1. Hardship is evident in the case due to the terrain and the existing harvesting macadamia nut trees.

Therefore, the Commission hereby grants to the applicant a variance from the minimum sideyard setback requirement pursuant to the authority vested in it by Section 36 of said Ordinance on the condition that:

- 1. The structure be placed as presented on the submitted drawings.
- 2. Conformance with all other pertinent regulations applicable.
