VARIANCE PERMIT

The Planning Commission held a public hearing on March 19, 1970 on the application of State of Hawaii for a variance from Section 13, Ordinance No. 63 of the Revised Ordinances of the County of Hawaii 1967, as amended, more specifically, to allow a variance from the minimum lot size requirement to permit the existence of the non-conforming remnant lots for beautification purposes, Tax Map Key: Portions of 1 - 6 and 2 - 2.

The Commission finds that strict enforcement of Section 13 would involve practical difficulty and unnecessary hardship for the following reasons:

- 1. Beautification aspects.
- 2. Public parcels involved.

Therefore, the Commission hereby grants to the applicant a variance from the minimum lot size requirement pursuant to the authority vested in it by Section 36 of said Ordinance on the condition that:

1. No structures shall be built upon said non-conforming parcels acquired by the State.
