Application for VARIANCE by JOHN NEVILLE from FRONT YARD SETBACK REQUIREMENT in KAIEIE, S. HILO

Variance No. 199

VARIANCE PERMIT

The Planning Commission held a public hearing on March 19, 1970 on the application of John Neville for a variance from Section 13, Ordinance No. 63 of the Revised Ordinances of the County of Hawaii 1967, as amended, more specifically, to allow a variance from the front yard setback requirement for a proposed residential dwelling, Tax Map Key 2-7-06:4.

The Commission finds that strict enforcement of Section 13 would involve practical difficulty and unnecessary hardship for the following reasons:

- 1. That there are unusual circumstances applying to the subject property which do not generally apply to surrounding property in the same district.
- 2. That said unusual circumstances exist either to a degree which deprives the owner or applicant of substantial property rights which would otherwise be available, or to a degree which obviously interferes with the best use or manner of development of the subject property.

Therefore, the Commission hereby grants to the applicant a variance from the front yard setback requirement pursuant to the authority vested in it by Section 36 of said Ordinance on the condition that:

- 1. Construction shall begin within one year of effective date of the approval of the variance.
- 2. Construction shall be as basically represented in the application submitted.
- 3. Conformance with all other applicable regulations of the County.
