VARIANCE PERMIT

The County Planning Commission at a duly held public hearing on May 11, 1972, considered the application of the U. S. Corps of Engineers for a variance from Section 9-H, Ordinance No. 62 of the Revised Ordinances of the County of Hawaii 1967, as amended. More specifically, the request was to allow the waivering of the requirement of monumenting of a newly created 2.789 acre parcel located in the Kilauea Forest Reserve area, Keauhou, Ka'u, Hawaii, TMK: 9-9-01: por. 4.

The Commission has found that the purpose of the subdivision is to provide a water catchment area to serve the Kilauea Military Camp area. Thus, granting of the variance would be serving a public need and would not be materially detrimental to the public health, safety or welfare.

Therefore, the Commission hereby grants to the applicant a variance to waiver the requirement of monumenting of a newly created 2.789 acre parcel pursuant to the authority vested in it by Section 36 of said Ordinance.

The effective date of this permit shall be from May 11, 1972.
