Gentlemen:


At its meeting on December 29, 1971, the Trustees of Liliuokalani Trust decided to ask to withdraw its petition (A69-230) for urban classification of 630 acres of land at Keahuolu, North Kona, Hawaii.

As you know, the Trust has sought and received deferment on this petition during the period that Hawaii County was completing work on its new general plan. That plan has now been officially adopted by the Hawaii County Council. The 630 acres of land included in the application to the Land Use Commission are shown as urban expansion on the new general plan. The Trust interprets urban expansion to reflect future and alternate areas for urban development. Therefore, to comply with the new plan, the Trust would like to withdraw its request noting that at a future date the land will be used for urban expansion. At that time, a new application will be filed.

We appreciate your patience during the long delay in deciding on an appropriate action for this petition; however, it was felt desirable to wait for guidance from Hawaii County.
