I do not think there is a public access requirement in the Subdivision permit. However, in the SUB permit condition, there is a conservation permit requirement. In the DLNR conservation district use permit CDUP, there are requirements for a 40-foot shoreline set back. In this 40 ft. shoreline set back (might have been changed to 20ft. shoreline set back), they need to ensure that no public access to this 40 ft. shoreline set back is prohibited.

OR..... the Lateral pedestrian public access is in a SMA but it is still in the application phase. (see permitlog \rightarrow yr2011docs \rightarrow sub06000396latPedstrnPubAcc **AND** sub06000396smaRecpt

DLNR Chairperson also states that "Lateral access along the shoreline will be maintain in accordance with state and county laws".

This permit refers to trail 292 on Arc Reader, which has a "permit" status.
