I not sure what we will be doing with this situation regarding sand being dumped at the shoreline. Based upon the inspection, it appears that there is not a sand source in the vicinity to have that type (mixed white beach sand) of sand to wash up on the beach. We took samples of other areas within the cell and got much darker sand from the other beaches. In addition, the pockets adjacent to the area did not contain any comparable sand to this lighter sand. However the big question that we have is where did this sand come from?

After we compare notes (shoreline inspection and inspection that we [Brad- Coastal Geologist and I] conducted) we will be coming out with some kind of statement to the Landowner/Lessee.

Andy & Brad are not in the Office this week and I need to seek their advice, expertise

Regarding the sand-it will most likely be a stern warning

The shoreline may have encroachments that may hold up certification, but Andy/Land will be reporting on that.

I will be sure to send you a copy of whatever we say.

Hey Bethany,

Good to hear from you. Sorry I've been so out of touch of late. Things always seem to be so busy around here and i end up getting focused on shorelines at the expense of other things, like the law center grant: (Anyway, OCCL does have several things going on relating to the property at Manini Beach. First, we received a violation report informing us that "someone" had been trucking sand in and placing it on the beach. Brad Romine (UH Sea Grant) and Tiger Mills (OCCL) did a site visit on May 10th and confirmed that there was indeed new sand in the area, and that the sand did not appear to be the result of natural deposition. I'm not sure what course of action OCCL is planning to take on this matter. Tiger are I are supposed to be talking about this sometime tomorrow. The adjacent property owner (Healy) also submitted an application for a certified shoreline. Reid and I conducted a shoreline site visit on May 14th. During the site visit, we identified several issues on or makai of the shoreline including backfill (sand and dirt), planting (grass, shrubs, and irrigation lines), and structures (small rock walls, CRM retaining walls, and remnants of two CRM structures). These issues are all encroachments and will need to be resolved prior to certification.

The recommended shoreline location is well mauka of the proposed shoreline location identified on the survey map. The recommended shoreline is approximately 12' mauka of the coconut trees along the SW end of the shoreline, and near the CRM retaining wall along the back of the property. The "area of sudden erosion" is irrelevant and will not affect the location of the shoreline OR the adjacent property owner's property boundary. We will be issuing a letter to the applicant indicating the changes to the shoreline location and the encroachments that will need to be resolved prior to certification. The surveyor will need to submit a revised map showing the new shoreline location before we can proceed. I'll be in the office tomorrow if you'd like to discuss this further. Hope all's well with you. Please give my best to everyone!


Happy Springtime!

Our Office has gotten several complaints regarding the Manini Beach area and a 'park' that has recently been created on TMK: (3) 8-2-006:027.

According to the complainants, no 'public review' was conducted prior to creating the park in the SMA and the residents state that use of the lot as a park, siting of the porta pottie, dumping of sand and construction of the wall and gate were not authorized.

Parking, smells from the porta pottie, the potential for the high tide to reach the porta pottie were never addressed or considered.

When this private park was created, was the community involved or consulted? Do they have a SMA permit or is there an exemption letter?



We are attempting to address the alleged sand issue as our jurisdiction is makai of the shoreline but we dont have much to go on.

Landowner Kamehameha Schools was informed regarding the sand issue and they went to the site asked the caretaker on site was told no introduction of sand to the area occurred.

We have one resident stating that trucks came down a month after the tsunami and dumped sand there. The sand does appear to be natural sand.

You guys have anything on this?

Resident, Gordon Leslie has been very vocal regarding this issue and probably will go to the media.

Any kind of authorization on the County's part regarding this park will be appreciated.
